The partnership is dedicated to the revitalization of the Clifton Heights neighborhood

through various initiatives and redevelopment projects.

Susan Heinrich from CANS:

- The next fundraiser at Dewey's is on Oct 24 with a portion of the proceeds going to CANS. Everything including supplies is free at CANS.
- The annual Fall Fundraiser starts this week. The CUFNA website will have the informational flyer.
- Basketball practice starts soon at the school. CANS is looking for volunteer basketball coaches for elementary school students at 2:30pm. Daniel Cummins will reach out to UC students for interest in coaching through the Learning Commons newsletter.
- CANS is looking to start an after-school dance team for elementary school students.
- Food Pantry/Little Library CUFNA gave \$250. CANS used the money to convert a TV cabinet for storage & stocked it with food. Daniel Cummins said the UC Resource Center can supplement the Pantry.

- Homecoming is Oct 28. Students will arrive at Hughes at 9:00pm & will be sent home at 11:00pm.
- The area around Hughes is backed up between 7:30-8:00am because Hughes is cell phone free. The students standing line to get a pouch to put their phone in. The pouches are locked up until the end of the day.
- Hughes passed the first quarter Fire Department inspection. This allows them to provide food for students. There are 1200 students. They are still working on a fire plan.
- Hughes passed on their lockdown drill & received a 100% on lab inspections.
- Hughes is partnering with UC, collecting food for the Veterans Hospital for homeless vets during November.
- Hughes is collecting hygiene donations between 7:30am-3:30pm at the Hughes school office for their students in need during November.

- NSP (Neighborhood Support Program). The City's Neighborhood Support Program (NSP) provides annual funding to Community Councils for neighborhood projects and activities. It is our main source of funding. A Community Council's NSP proposal must be approved in an open meeting which includes any residents living within that neighborhood, then a presentation to the NSP Review Committee made of other neighborhoods.
- Mary Singler presented the survey results: The fund allocation is prioritized at the annual meeting in November. CUF is expecting to receive \$7,000.
- The NSP Survey had 21 responses with 24 ideas. 6 ideas are already in process. There were 12 new ideas: 50% related to neighborhood beautification; 38% related to trash cans. 2 ideas were out of scope: improving the entrance to Fairview Park, including updated signage; improving Hollister Triangle, which is privately owned.

- Treasurer Report (below). The Treasurer says we have about \$5,000 to use by the end of the year if anyone has suggestions. Our 2 main sources of income are from NSP & Invest In Neighborhoods.
- University of Cincinnati update: Megan Smith says UC is collecting data on Jefferson Ave for Pedestrian Safety & will share the findings with the City.
- UC has not bought the Crematorium for student housing.
- University Relations/Town & Gown: Tracy Schwetschenau, Daniel Cummings, Brooke Lipscomb.
- Daniel & Brooke have done 3 Walks & Talks in the CUF neighborhood with CPD, UCPD, &the Building & Planning Departments.
- The Government Relations Office, CPD, the City Manager Office & Daniel Cummins are working together to improve conditions in the neighborhood.
- Student ambassadors have been hired: Christina, Ally, Ha, Jabe, Liam, Josh, & Emily were present at the meeting. Welcome! Last month Ryan, from Hughes, worked with the student ambassadors.
- Trinitas and The Hub/Hotel Celare (Straight and Clifton)submitted major signage amendment without opposition from CUFNA. Final meeting 10/20/23 (Mark Becher). Betsy says Trinitas has a meeting with City Planning this Friday on the signage amendment.

UC student class of 2024, Abdul Charif, whose education research project has been focusing


- on pedestrian safety in the neighborhood, will provide a presentation for the community.



### **Urban Agriculture mini grants**

from the city of Cincinnati:

The Office of Environment and Sustainability has announced the Urban Agriculture Program Mini Grant Opportunity for the upcoming year. This program annually bolsters the local agricultural community as it provides financial grants to support agricultural production and growing sites, as well as local food aggregation and distribution sites in Cincinnati. For those eager to participate in this round of the Urban Agriculture Program Mini Grant Opportunity, the application process as well as funding guidelines are now open and can be accessed on the Office of Environment and Sustainability website. Applications will be accepted through November 17th.

### **New plans for Central Parkway**

In late October the Cincinnati Department of Transportation & Engineering shared a draft of the preferred plan for Central Parkway between Plum and Liberty streets.

"The draft preferred alternative was developed from four preliminary concepts shared with the public in late August. Those concepts and the current draft are based on feedback gathered during a public work session and from surveys.

Highlights include:

- Significantly increased landscaping and tree canopy
- Half the amount of pavement
- · Nearly half as much median area
- · Raised, planted medians, where possible
- A large pedestrian plaza adjacent to TQL Stadium
- Greatly reduced pedestrian crosswalk distances
- Separated/protected sidewalk-level bike lanes along the length of the corridor
- New lighting along the entire corridor and at intersections
- New traffic signals


### **Old CUF**
