The agenda for the meeting is to review and approve the minutes of the Fund's previous annual meeting, vote to elect members to the Board of Trustees, review the financial report and projects completed, and discuss current issues pertaining to the Fund.

CUF Community Fund Membership Requirements

To be a Member of the CUF Community Fund, one must be a paid member of the CUF Neighborhood Association for twenty-four months prior to the annual meeting of the Members and must be a permanent resident residing within Clifton Heights, University Heights or Fairview as designated in the by-laws of the CUF Neighborhood Association or its successor organization. A permanent resident is defined as one residing year around within the CUF community for at least four consecutive

years (48 months) immediately preceding consideration of Member status. The burden of satisfying the requirement of permanent residency is upon the individual seeking to be a Member.
